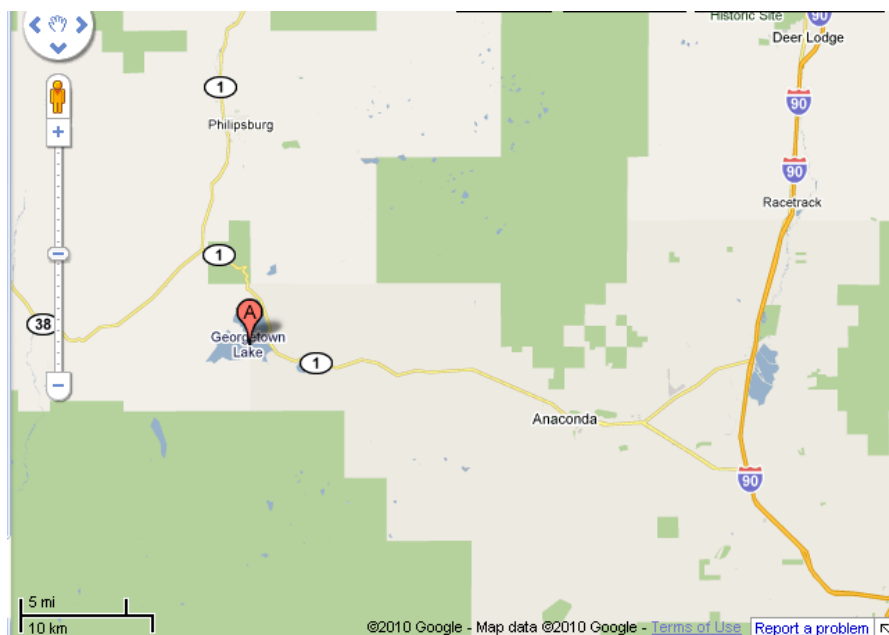

FRENCH CAMP AT GEORGETOWN LAKE

Sunday, July 25 – Friday, July 30 2010

Directions to Camp Watanopa: Camp Watanopa is 100 miles southeast of Missoula, and fewer than 50 miles southwest of Butte. From Missoula, take I-90 east for 75 miles, then take the Drummond exit south on Highway 1 towards Philipsburg, continuing past Philipsburg until you see the dam at the west end of the lake. Turn right and drive across the dam. Approximately 2 ½ miles later you will see a road on the left after a sign indicating picnic grounds & Camp Watanopa. Turn left on this road and then quickly right. French Camp is usually marked with balloons and a French camp sign.



Coming from Butte or other points east on I-90, take the Anaconda exit and follow Highway 1, continuing around the north side of the lake until you see the dam. Georgetown Lake can also be accessed from the Bitterroot Valley via Skalkaho Pass (Road 38 – parts are unpaved.)

Campers should arrive between 3:00 and 4:00 PM. on Sunday, July 25. Parents are welcome to stay until 5:00 to help

campers get settled. Camp must be vacated Friday, July 30 before noon. Parents are invited to arrive by 10:00 AM to enjoy the final program and closing ceremonies with the campers. Campers should depart by 11:30 AM.

What to bring: Warm sleeping bag or bedroll, pillow, clothes for all types of weather – swim suit, shorts, t-shirts, sweatshirt, warm jacket, water-repellent jacket, jeans, hat, sturdy sports shoes, beach sandals, pajamas, extra socks & underwear – 2 towels, toiletries, insect repellent, sunscreen, camera, a French dictionary if you have one, and a desire to learn and speak French! You may bring fishing poles, frisbees, hackey sacks, and musical instruments, but please do not bring English books and magazines, headsets or electronic games, money, jewelry, or valuables.
